



Renewable Energy Zones

It's only the beginning

The team at Renewables, Climate and Future Industries Tasmania spent much of 2022 researching regions across the state, for their potential to host Renewable Energy Zones (REZ).

This included spatial mapping, technical studies and engagement with stakeholders like yourselves. We ran an awareness campaign to reach communities, as well as conducting a series of conversations on-ground. This is just the beginning of the [process](#) much more work is required to plan, design and implement REZ.



North west in focus

In December 2022, the Minister announced the north west of Tasmania as the first region to be explored in detail for its potential to host the State's first REZ.

The next steps involve engagement with community, a detailed examination of how any future REZ may overlap with existing land uses and values, the ability of the network to host more renewables, and market interest in new generation.

Engagement

Understanding how REZ can be done well from a local perspective and what communities expect in the way of benefits is vital to getting this right.

As a first step we are establishing Stakeholder Reference Groups in the north west to inform the REZ planning, design and establishment. Expressions of interest to be part of the group are currently [open](#).


We are also recruiting a local REZ Liaison Officer, to be an on ground point of contact.

Over the course of the year we will run a series of community engagement information sessions on what REZ is and forums asking people to provide input into the REZ planning process.

For the other REZ regions in the state, more detailed engagement will commence in late 2023 or early 2024.
